Year 5 delved into ecosystems, collaborating across classrooms to create food webs and cycles using cardboard and string, which helped them visualise the interdependence of living organisms. Overall, it has been a week rich in collaboration, exploration, and skill development across all year groups.

Please note that all personal data received will be processed only as necessary and in accordance with ESF's personal data handling policy available on the ESF website.

Completed nomination forms, together with the optional personal statement, should be signed and handed in/posted to the school office. Should you wish to email the nomination form and personal statement you may send these to gloria.so@glenealy.edu.hk

The last date for the receipt of nomination forms and the optional personal statements is Friday 1st November 2024.

Ballot papers will be issued on Friday 8 November 2024. Where the number of candidates standing for election is equal to or less than the number of vacancies on the School Council, the need for an election will be dispensed with and the candidate will be elected unopposed.

## **UR STRONG**



## **BOX OF HOPE**


