Dear Parents,

These last few weeks marked the start of our camps. These camps are essential for supporting the social and emotional development of our students, providing challenges that build resilience while ensuring everyone has fun. Beyond the activities themselves, these experiences often become some of our students' fondest memories of their time at Glenealy school. The camps create strong bonds across the year groups with collaboration and problem-solving during outdoor challenges and cultural experiences.

Year 3 St Stephen's Beach Camp - Last week, Year 3 students enjoyed their day camp at St Stephen's Beach and worked to develop their paddling and water skills. The camp provided a great opportunity for students to collaborate and work together to take on challenges and support one another.

Year 4 Silvermine Bay Overnight Camp - Our Year 4 students enjoyed their first overnight camp at Silvermine Bay in Mui Wo, where they took part in a range of exciting outdoor experiences. They learned fundamental paddling skills on Giant Stand-Up Paddleboards and explored the local area through a hike along nearby trails. The camp also provided opportunities for team collaboration during pioneering activities.

Year 6 Huanghua Village, Qingyuan, China Camp - Year 6 Our Y6 students are arriving home this evening from their 4 day camp to Huanghua Village in Qingyuan China. During their adventure, they took part in a range of exciting outdoor challenge activities such as rock climbing and abseiling, building confidence, teamwork, and resilience along the way. Beyond the physical challenges, students had the opportunity to explore the local community and immerse themselves in Chinese culture, from picking and making milk tea at a tea plantation to shopping in a local dried fruit stall and engaging with the traditions and language of the region.

This week, we have been fortunate to welcome 11 students from Island School who are volunteering across all our Y1 to Y5 classrooms and specialist lessons. These shared work experience opportunities play a crucial role in strengthening partnerships between Glenealy and Island School, enabling visiting students to gain valuable insights into teaching and learning while making meaningful contributions to our school community. Through collaboration and shared experiences, we continue to build strong connections that enrich learning for everyone involved.

This year's Box of Hope donations have been successfully collected, and we thank everyone for their generosity. These boxes will bring joy to many less privileged children in the Asia Pacific region. We are thrilled to report a record number of boxes collected. The allocated house points will be announced at the next assembly by our House Captains.

SEAT BELT SAFETY

We're Ahead of the Curve at Glenealy

We would like to share an important update regarding Hong Kong's new seatbelt regulations, which will take effect on 25 January 2026. The law will require all passengers on buses and minibuses equipped with seat belts to wear them at all times, including on school transport.

At Glenealy School, we are proud to say we're already ahead of this change. We have long expected our students to wear seatbelts on school buses, and we've worked closely with our transport providers, bus supervisors, and staff to ensure that every bus used to carry our students is equipped with seatbelts for all passengers and that they are worn.

Please note:

- The new law applies to school buses, non-franchised coaches, and cross-boundary services.
- Passengers who fail to wear seat belts may face a HK\$5,000 fine and up to three months' imprisonment.
- Responsibility for compliance lies with passengers, not with drivers.

Please remind your children to buckle up; it's a simple habit that keeps everyone safer.

EDB SCHOOL VISIT

Last week, we welcomed a team from the Education Department for a biannual compliance review. We are proud to share that our visit resulted in a glowing review. The team commended our strong alignment with government policies and regulations, and were especially impressed by the engaging, multipurpose environments that support student learning and wellbeing.

GLENEALY SCHOOL WELLBEING

Talking with Your Child About Friendship Fires® and Mean-on-Purpose Moments



At Glenealy, we use the URSTRONG program to help children build healthy, respectful friendships. One key concept is teaching children to recognise the difference between:

- Friendship Fires® regular ups and downs between friends, often caused by misunderstandings
- Mean-on-Purpose when someone is intentionally hurtful

This simple language helps children feel confident navigating conflict and prevents the misuse of terms like "bullying."

How can parents support their child in this at home?

- Ask the right question: Instead of "Was someone being mean?", try "Do you think it was a Friendship Fire or Mean-on-Purpose?"
- Focus on intent: Help your child reflect, "Did they mean to hurt your feelings, or was it a misunderstanding?"
- Coach, don't fix: Encourage your child to use URSTRONG strategies like Talk-it-Out for Friendship Fires or a Quick Comeback for Mean-on-Purpose moments.
- Validate their feelings: Let them know it's okay to feel hurt, confused, or unsure, and that friendships can change over time.
- Use the Friend-o-Meter: Talk about what makes a friendship feel good (green zone) or unsafe (red zone), and remind them they deserve respectful, feel-good friendships.



By using this shared language, we can help children develop into kind, confident, and emotionally intelligent friends, both at school and beyond.
